



### **WOMEN SELF HELP GROUP PROGRAMME**

With the aim of empowering the ordinary homemakers in the district who play a crucial role in the economic and cultural aspects, the People's Service Society, Palakkad formed Women Self Help groups(WSHGs). Empowerment activities are carried out through collective initiatives, such as Awareness Programs, Financial Literacy Campaigns, Income Generation Training, Entrepreneurial Skill Development Programs and access to necessary bank loans for starting enterprises are some of the activities undertaken. Now 400 Self Help Groups are operating in the district. Initiatives such as NABARD WSHG and NABARD E-Sakthi have been highly supportive of this endeavor.

The women in Self-Help Groups (SHGs) receive linkage loans, along with subsidies, to support their self-employment initiatives. This year, 90 groups secured loans totaling 37.3 million Rupees from various banks at subsidized interest rates. The beneficiaries use these loans to launch and sustain their self-employment ventures and repay them responsibly.

#### Credit Linkage With Federal bank

As part of women's empowerment, PSSP has partnered with Federal Bank to provide loans worth ₹3.01 crore (Three crore one lakh) to 51 groups. This initiative aims to support women in gaining financial independence and creating opportunities for economic growth. The loans are expected to help in the development of small businesses, employment generation, and other livelihood activities, thereby fostering women's entrepreneurship and empowerment.



#### International Women's Day Celebration

The People's Service Society (PSSP) celebrated this year's from International Women's Day on March 8, 2025, at the Pastoral Center in Palakkad, with the theme "Accelerating the Pace of Women's Empowerment." The event was marked by a cultural procession, which began at the Palakkad Mission School Junction and saw the participation of around 600 women. The procession was flagged off by the Sub Inspector of Palakkad Town Police Station, Mrs. C. Aishwarya.

A public meeting was held under the leadership of Mrs. Manju Binu, President of the District Women's Federation, and inaugurated by Palakkad MLA, Mr. Rahul Mankoottathil. During the event, the Bishop of Palakkad Diocese, Mar. Peter Kochupurayil, emphasized the importance of accelerating women's equality and strengthening women's mental resilience in his blessing speech.





#### Gandhi Jayanthi Celebration

The Senior Citizens' Day and Gandhi Jayanthi were celebrated under the leadership of the District Women's Federation of PSSP on 8th October 2024 at Snehajwala, Kottekkad, and Kripasadan, Malampuzha. The event was chaired by the President of the District Women's Federation, Mrs. Manju. The meeting commenced with a warm welcome by Coordinator Mr. Arun.

The members and office bearers of the District Women's Federation distributed gifts to all the residents of both institutions. Mrs. Shakuntala and Mrs. Valsamma expressed their gratitude and shared their thanks with the attendees.





#### Free skill Training

The Participatory Social Security Program PSSP has organized numerous free vocational training sessions for women's Self-Help Groups (SHGs). These training programs cover various skills such as soap production, cake making, curry powder production, Umbrella making, food processing, and tailoring. The training sessions have been conducted in different blocks to empower women with practical skills that will help them achieve financial independence and improve their economic condition.

These programs not only provide essential skills but also foster self-reliance among women, enabling them to start small businesses or contribute to their families' income. Through these initiatives, the PSSP aims to enhance the social and economic status of women, equipping them with tools for sustainable livelihood.



#### **Minority Loan**

PSSP Provides 2 Crore Rupees Loan to 49 Groups for Women Entrepreneurs under Minority Department

As part of its initiative to empower women entrepreneurs, PSSP has provided a loan of 2 crore rupees to 49 groups under the Minority Department. This financial assistance is aimed at nurturing women-led businesses and promoting self-reliance within minority communities. By offering these loans, PSSP supports women entrepreneurs in their efforts to grow and expand their ventures, contributing to their economic empowerment and overall community development.

#### PSSP Offering Affordable Stitching Training for Women's Groups

The People's Service Society Palakkad (PSSP) is offering an affordable stitching training program for women's groups. This initiative aims to empower women by providing them with skills in stitching and tailoring, which can help them become financially independent.

The program is designed to cater to women from Self-Help Groups (SHGs) at a nominal fee, ensuring that the training remains accessible to those from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. Through this initiative, PSSP hopes to support women in acquiring a practical skill that can either supplement their household income or be the foundation for starting small businesses.

Participants will learn various techniques and methods in stitching, enabling them to work in the garment industry, start their own tailoring business, or take up freelance work. PSSP's focus on affordability ensures that more women can join the program and benefit from it, contributing to their economic empowerment and self-reliance.

This initiative is part of PSSP's ongoing efforts to uplift marginalized groups through skill development and vocational training.







# **SERVICE PROVIDING CENTRE (SPC)**

#### SECOND FLOOR, SUB-REGISTRAR OFFICE BUILDING, VADAKKENCHERY

With the financial assistance from Department of Women and Child Development, Govt. Of Kerala, People's Service Society Palakkad has started a Service Providing Centre under Domestic Violence Act 2005. The centre is functioning with the assistance of Counselors of Family Counseling Centre at Vadakkenchery, Palakkad. The centre is to protect Women and Children from violence inside and outside of their house. Adv. Saranya.K. is the Legal Counselor of Service Providing Centre.

### **FAMILY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME**

### **SAFP INDIA**

Save A Family Plan, is an International Charitable Organization founded by Msgr. Augustine Kandathil in 1965. It assists the poor to walk on the road of self-reliance. The family Development program is the core program of SAFP. This Canadian-based organization supports poor families in India with regular monthly assistance for a sustainable livelihood. Donations to the Family Development Program are forwarded through the SAFP India office to the bank accounts of the recipient families.

#### Historical Background of the Family Development Program

The Family Development Program is being successfully run by People's Service Society, Palakkad (PSSP) since 1978. From 2021 onwards, partner families have been identified from six selected Panchayaths of Palakkad district as per the prescribed criteria of Save a Family Plan. From 1978, around 3800 families got benefit from this programme. The families have upgraded their livelihood through various Income Generation Programme, construction / renovation of their houses, infrastructure development, education of their children, medical treatment, and small business initiates etc.

#### **Cluster Meeting:**

As per the directions of SAFPI, each cluster has 20-25 families were formed in each panchayath. Partner families were divided into 14 clusters. Two cluster meetings of each cluster are held in a year. The first one is held in May to September in conjunction with the monitoring visit. During this period 14 cluster meeting were held. The coordinator explained the importance of monitoring visit to partner families. These visits also help the coordinator to make changes program implementation strategy and provide suggestions to partner families for their overall development. During the meeting, the members shared updates on their





respective activities. She also explained the importance of donor letter. The coordinator said it helps the donor to gain a deeper understanding of the partner family and how much their contributions and support have helped the family is achieve its goals. After that a small training session was conducted by the field coordinator. The topic was "Water, Health and Sanitation" in all cluster meetings and encouraging an open discussion among the participants. Each cluster has a president and a secretary, through whom information is passed on to the groups.



#### Monitoring of Small Business Initiatives

During the months of May to November the coordinator observed and evaluate the small business initiatives of all FDP partner families. During the reporting period, the coordinator visited 186 partner families. The Field Coordinator conducted the monitoring visit by visiting the Partner family and assessing the implemented activity. The field coordinator evaluated whether the activity implemented was profitable or not and how it was profitable for the family.









#### **Progress Report Preparation of the Graduating Families**

The coordinator has to prepare the progress report of the graduating families, those are completed their 70 months of support in FDP. In this report the partner family shares their development and express their gratitude towards the donor's as well as the SAFP team. Also, the coordinator explains how the family has changed from the beginning and attained to set goals in these years. During this reporting period 2 partner family's progress report along with their family photo has uploaded in DDMS portal.

#### SECOND FLOOR, SUB-REGISTRAR OFFICE BUILDING, VADAKKENCHERY

Family Counselling Centre is being run by the People's Service Society, Palakkad as a project aided by the Central Social Welfare Board and Women and Child Department. The Center was established in the year 2009.

#### **Objectives**

- To provide an intensive level of support to families or individual members.
- To provide awareness about family problems, marital problems, and adolescent problems.
- To educate both clients and family members, on how to handle their problems.

#### **Activities done**

- Conducted neighborhood meetings in every month.
- Organized awareness classes in Nelliyampathy, Vadakkencherry, Puthur, and Mangalamdam.
- Visits were made to Nemmara and Nelliyampathy Police station.
- Active participation occurred in the Vanitha Commission Adalath sitting.
- Conducted sub-committee meetings regularly.
- Held a counselling camp in Valliyode.

# **SKILL DEVELOPMENT**

# JAN SHIKSHAN SANSTHAN PALAKKAD (JSS)

The Scheme of Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) formerly known as Shramik Vidyapeeth was a unique creation of Government of India in the country since 1967 with 100% grants from the Government of India. It is conceived as an institute for conducting skill up gradation programme in non-formal mode in the urban and rural areas of the district. The scheme was renamed as Jan Shikshan Sansthan in the year 2000. JSS scheme was transferred from Ministry of Education (erstwhile Ministry of Human Resource Development) to Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship in July, 2018. At present, 289



JSSs in 26 States and 7 Union Territories are functional. All the Jan Shikshan Sansthans are registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. The affairs of Jan Shikshan Sansthan are managed by respective Board of Management approved by the Government of India. From this financial year 2024-25 onwards, JSS has been migrated to Skill India Digital Hub (SIDH) Portal.

The mandate of the scheme is to provide vocational skills in non-formal mode to non-literate, neo-literates, persons with rudimentary level of education up to 8th and school drop-outs up to 12th standard in the age group of 15-45 years. The priority groups are women, SC, ST, minorities and other backward sections of the society. JSSs are reaching to the unreached areas to cater the needs of the poorest of the poor. They work at the door step of the beneficiaries with a minimum infrastructure and resources.



Jan Shikshan Sansthan Palakkad was sanctioned to the parent body, People's Service Society Palakkad by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India in the November 2007. It is registered under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 with Reg. No. CA 27/2008.

Since 2007, Jan Shikshan Sansthan Palakkad is contributing to improve the lives of the marginalized people through building the skills and developing the human resource to suit their livelihood requirements through different income generation programmes and till this time JSS have successfully trained

more than 31399 trainees under the target category.



In the financial year 2024-2025, Jan Shikshan Sansthan Palakkad with the financial help of Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship and with the objective of providing occupational skills and technical knowledge and to raise the efficiency and ability of the people has prosperously completed Skill Training in 90 Batches of different courses benefiting 1800 beneficiaries in Palakkad. The Institute is actively engaged in promoting entrepreneurship education, research, training, and institution building. The Institute plays a major role in creating and sharpening the entrepreneurial culture in the country.

#### Micro Skill Development Programme (MSDP)

The Micro Skill Development Programme (MSDP) is aimed at creating and fostering women entrepreneurs and also has an essential role in the country's economic growth. The objective of MSDP Training is to strengthen and increase the number of enterprises by building up skills and enhancing their livelihood. People's Service Society, Palakkad (PSSP) is the Partner Implementing Agency of EDII for conducting the Micro Skill Development Programme (MSDP) since 2017. PSSP has successfully trained 317 interested candidates in the years 2023-2024 and altogether 1843 members were trained through 34 batches. In the current year, 227 trainees from 5 batches had started units and increased their livelihood. The details are as follows.

The program extends its support through various avenues including market access, knowledge and networking, mentoring, product and business development, and technology empowering women entrepreneurs in their ventures.









### **SUCCESS STORIES**

#### 1. SUBEENA AND SAJEENA - COOKIEZ FOODS, MOOLAMKODE, KIZHEKKENCHERY, PALAKKAD

Cookiez is a Self Help Group (SHG) consisting of eight members, all of whom are housewives from the Kizhekkenchery Grama Panchayath. The group participated in the EDII-MSDP training program on agro millet and food processing products, held at the Grama Panchayath Hall in Kizhekkenchery, Palakkad.

After successfully completing the training, two members—Subeena and Sajeena—took the initiative to start a unit named Cookiez Foods at Moolamkode, Kizhekkenchery. The unit specializes in millet-based products such as millet laddu, millet cakes, millet jilebi, millet pickles, and more. All members are skilled in preparing these millet products and currently earn ₹300 per day. The group is happy with the progress, and the unit is running smoothly.

Production is carried out in their homes, and they receive regular orders from households and nearby shops. Located near Vadakkenchery—a developing town—they are branding and marketing their products under the name Cookiez Foods, primarily through social media platforms. There is a growing demand for millet-based products, and their business is steadily gaining traction.

The project is profitable, as they are able to procure raw materials at wholesale rates, which keeps production costs low and ensures a good profit margin. Additionally, there is strong demand for millet-based products. On average, each member earns around ₹500 in profit per day. Both Subeena and Sajeena are highly skilled in their work and are successfully earning an income. They are happy, motivated, and proud to be contributing to their household finances.







#### II. PRAGEETHA - KOCHAMMA KRISHIKOOTTAM, PERUVEMBU, PALAKKAD

Prageetha, a member of a Self Help Group and a housewife, attended the EDII-MSDP training on agro millet and food processing products held at the Grama Panchayath Hall in Kizhekkenchery, Palakkad. After successfully completing the training, she established her own unit named Kochamma Krishikoottam in Peruvembu, Palakkad.

She produces a variety of millet-based items, including snacks, laddu, cakes, squashes, and biscuits. Operating from her home, Prageetha now earns around ₹400 per day. The unit is running smoothly, and



she is happy with the progress.

She markets her products under the brand Kochamma Krishikoottam, and being located near Vadakkenchery—a growing town—she receives regular orders from local households and nearby shops. By promoting her products on social media platforms like WhatsApp and Facebook, she has been able to increase visibility and generate more orders. With rising demand for millet-based products, her venture continues to grow steadily.

The project has proven to be profitable for Prageetha. By sourcing raw materials at wholesale prices, she is able to keep production costs low, resulting in a good profit margin. With a strong demand for millet products, she now earns approximately ₹300 in profit per day.

The training program played a significant role in improving her livelihood. Prior to attending the training, she was a housewife who relied entirely on her husband for financial support. Today, she is actively involved in running her unit and earning a steady income. Motivated and enthusiastic, Prageetha is successfully managing her business and building a brighter future for herself.





#### III. KERALEEYAM FOODS, KALLADIPPATTA, ONGALLUR, PALAKKAD

**Keraleeyam Foods**, based in Kalladippatta, Ongallur, is a Self Help Group comprising seven members: Jisha A., Remya P., Akhila K.R., Sajitha, Sumithra, Devi, and Smitha. All are housewives who attended the EDII-MSDP training on agro millet and food processing products at the Grama Panchayath Hall in Ongallur, Pattambi.

Following the successful completion of the training, they collectively launched **Keraleeyam Foods**. The unit specializes in millet-based snacks such as biscuits, cakes, mixtures, and squashes. Each member is skilled in preparing millet products, and they currently earn about ₹350 per day. The unit is operating smoothly, and the members are happy and motivated.

Production is carried out in their homes, and the products are marketed under the brand **Keraleeyam Foods**. Located near Pattambi—a growing town—they regularly receive orders from local households and shops. They actively promote their products through social media platforms like WhatsApp and Facebook, which has helped increase visibility and generate more orders. With rising demand for millet-based items, the group is experiencing steady growth and success.

The project has proven to be profitable. By purchasing raw materials at wholesale rates, the group is able



to keep production costs low, resulting in good profit margins. With strong demand for millet products, each member earns approximately ₹300 in profit per day.

All seven members are highly skilled in their work and are successfully earning an income. The training program played a vital role in improving their livelihoods. Before attending the training, they were housewives who depended entirely on their families for financial support. Today, they are actively involved in running their unit and earning a steady income. Their enthusiasm and dedication have been key to the ongoing success of **Keraleeyam Foods**.





#### IV. THECAKER BY SALEENA AFSAL, WEST KAIPPURAM, PATTAMBI, PALAKKAD

Saleena, a housewife from Ongallur, Pattambi, attended the EDII-MSDP training on Agro Millet and Food Processing Products (focused on laddu and biscuits) held at Ongallur Grama Panchayath Hall, Palakkad. After successfully completing the training, she established her own unit named THECAKER (SNA Foods) at West Kaippuram, Pattambi.

She produces a variety of millet-based items including millet laddu, biscuits, cakes, sweets, pickles, and coconut buns. In addition to running her business, Saleena also offers training to others on preparing agro millet products. Currently, she earns around ₹750 per day and is very happy with the progress of her unit, which is operating smoothly.

Saleena receives regular orders from nearby shops, supermarkets, and bakeries, and promotes her

products actively through social media, which has helped boost visibility and sales. Her husband, friends, and relatives also support her in marketing efforts. Residing in a densely populated area, she frequently gets orders from neighbors and nearby stores. She delivers cakes based on pre-orders and sources raw materials as needed, although prices may vary depending on market fluctuations.

The project is proving to be profitable for Saleena. By sourcing raw materials at wholesale rates, she is able to keep production costs low, resulting in a healthy profit margin. On average, she earns around ₹750 per day.

The training program played a significant role in enhancing her livelihood. She is now fully dedicated to managing her unit and is earning a stable income. With great enthusiasm and determination, she is steadily working towards expanding her business in the future.







#### V. Jasmine Bags and Tailors, Poolaparambu, Pallassana, Palakkad

Jasmine Bags and Tailors is a Self Help Group (SHG) consisting of nine members—Radha, Faridha, Indira Rani, Divya, Jora, Suchithra, Ramya, Priya, and Chithra—from Pallassana, Palakkad. All members are housewives who attended the EDII-MSDP training on eco-friendly jute laptop bags at the Grama Panchayath Kudumbashree Hall in Cheramangalam, Pallassana.

After successfully completing the training, they launched their unit, Jasmine Bags and Tailors, located at Poolaparambu, Pallassana. The group specializes in making jute laptop bags, pouches, and ladies' garments. All members are skilled tailors and currently earn around ₹200 per day. They are happy with the progress, and the unit is running smoothly.

The group receives regular orders for jute laptop bags from school and college students, as well as neighbors. Being close to Koduvayoor, a nearby town and business hub, they also get orders from local shops for ladies' garments and bulk orders for cloth bags. They take customized orders from nearby schools and retail stores and promote their products actively on social media, which helps in attracting more customers. Raw materials are procured based on demand, though costs may vary depending on market rates.

All members are highly skilled in making the products and are producing items based on customer orders. The project is profitable, with each member earning approximately ₹200 in profit per day. In addition, they also take up work on a piece-rate basis.

The training program played a crucial role in enhancing their livelihood. They are now actively involved in their unit and earning a steady income. With great enthusiasm and commitment, the group is working towards gradually expanding and developing their business.

# **PSSP MIGRANT SURAKSHA PROJECT**

People's Service Society Palakkad Migrant Suraksha Project for the migrant community in Malappuram started functioning as on December 1, 2014 in Perinthalmanna with an objective of prevention of HIV and basic STI and health services and promotion and distribution of free condoms, for the migrant community in Malappuram. The project has been taken up by PSSP (People's Service Society Palakkad) and been designed and monitored by Kerala State AIDS Control Society (KSACS) in accordance with the guidelines of NACO, Government of India.

#### PSSP MIGRANT SURAKSHA PROJECT MALAPPURAM

The Project is covering a population of 10000 HR migrants in three areas viz. Perinthalmanna, Kottakal, Malappuram in Malappuram District. PSSP Migrant Suraksha intervention focuses on providing services to high risk migrant population in Malappuram District. Project Conducting Awareness programs, condom promotion, Group session, Street plays/AV shows, Exhibitions, Counselling, Health camps, STI Screening, Community based HIV Screening, Sensitization and advocacy programs for various Migrant stake holders. In the present scenario our team consists of 6 staff including Project Manager, Counsellor, MEA officer and 3 outreach workers. Besides we have 7 Peer Leaders in Malappuram District.

PSSP Migrant TI Suraksha is a project organized by the combined effort of National Aids Control Organization, Kerala State Aids Control Society in order to take precautions to prevent HIV/AIDS among migrant laboures, who are residing in Malappuram district. Now a day's number of migrant inflow is increasing in Malappuram district. Most of the Migrants in Malappuram District are working in construction field. According to statistics more than 80000 people are working in Malappuram District. To make the intervention feasible, the project classified the migrants on the basis of their source state. Among the identified migrants 30% of them are from West Bengal, 25% of them from Bihar, 10% of them from Assam, 10% from Tamil Nadu, 5% from Jharkhand, 5% From Kerala 5% From Odisha

5% From Kerala and remaining 5% from other States.

Last year project established a Steering Committee having District Collector as Chairman and District Medical Officer as Convenor. Besides project established Local advisory Committee in Malappuram, Parappanangadi and Perinthalmanna Municipalities.





#### Goal of the project

The goal of the intervention is to contribute in the national goal of **halt and reverse the HIV/AIDS** epidemic among the Migrants living in the Malappuram District of Kerala State.

#### **Activities of the Project**

*Entry level Activities:* Including Rapid Site Assessment by conducting rapid survey for identifying the migrants population in the target area. Spot mapping, identification of local sex network, stakeholder analyses, Development of micro plan, local service providers etc.

**Prevention Package:** The component will ensure prevention activities such as information dissemination, condom programming, and STI management.

*Health Care Services:* Identification and contracting PPP clinics in each site in consultation with HRMs, Establishing Linkage with existing public health care system, Organizing Health Camps to screen HR Migrants for STI, STI Screening, Treatment for STIs identified, Provision of RR/RA/STI counselling to HRMs, TB Referral-Identified cases from HRM to DOT Centre (RNTCP)

*Condom Promotion and Distribution Programmes:* Demand generation for condom usage within the community through IEC activities, establishing condom outlets in all congregation points, distribution of condom through CSM



ICTC screening and ART Referral: Establishing linkage with ICTCs, ART Centers and CCCs in the District Screening for HIV among HR Migrants with the support of ICTC Centers, linking identified HIV cases from HRM to ART Centre Psyco-social support to identified HIV cases from migrants (Counselling support, capacity building, financial support for livelihood options)



# Establishing linkages Provision of legal services to the HRM who denied employment on the basis of their HIV status, denied treatment, violation of human rights, etc. with the support of human right agencies operating in the area

There are many reasons to include migrant labourers in this project. People who are staying away from home often will have a feel of loneliness. Therefore people will often depend on smoking, alcohol,

drugs in an unlimited quantity and often reaches in sex risk. In this condition they will reach to core group of sex worker. In this time risk increases. There are chances for people to have high sex risk while they are traveling to their state / back to Kerala. In our study we found that migrant labourers are mostly addicted to alcohol and this is a main factor for sexual risk. PSSP



Migrant Suraksha covering above mentioned people and providing various services (eg. STI Screening, CBHS, Counseling etc...) to them.

As it has reached its eighth year, Project covered approximately 3 lakhs migrants and 40009 migrants in this year only, in which 10023 of them are with high risk. Among the identified migrants 30% of them are from West Bengal, 25% of them from Bihar, 10 % of them from Assam, 10% from Tamil Nadu and 5% from Jharkhand 5% From Odisha 5% From Kerala and remaining 10% from other State. Project Conducted 103 Health camps in this year. 6004 Migrants Utilized STI (sexual Disease) Screening Service through health Camps and DICs in this year only. 33 STI cases were identified in this phase. CBHS is another service carried out by the Suraksha project. 1648 Migrants were Tested HIV/AIDS through Community Based Screening (CBS) and 1353 Migrants were referred by PSSP Migrant Project to ICTC for HIV/AIDS testing in the last year. Project Covering 240 Spots in Different Areas of Malappuram. Condom service is given through outlets. As per NACO guideline project created 51 outlets in project area. Most outlets are non-Traditional Outlets (Petti shop, Pan Shop etc...) 7709 condoms were distributed through DICs condom outlets, Health camps and Counselling.

ART Linkage is another important component in Project Process. PSSP Migrant Suraksha Project Identified 24 HIV Positive case and 20 of them successfully linked to ART centers. Project have registration of Migrant female FSWs and project taking good initiative for tracking their partners and testing their HIV and VDRLs. Project have a DIC at Perinthalmanna & Manjeri, Average 10 migrants are utilizing DIC services per day. Project is distributing general medicines and STI medicines through the health Camps. Those Medicines are mobilizing from medical representatives, IMA etc.... Project

Conducted variety of awareness programs including street theatres in this phase. Most of those AV shows were provided HIV/AIDS knowledge, STI Knowledge etc.... Counseling is an important component of project,4182 Migrants were covered counseling service. Through this project has a good advocacy committee in District level. Most of the programs are



conducting in association with Health Department, Labour Department and Other Government Bodies. PSSP Migrant Suraksha Project is running its eighth Phase. Now this program becomes a successful program in state level.



#### CANCER CARE CAMPAIGN - CLOSE THE CARE GAP

With strong focus on prevention, the Aashakiranam Cancer care campaign promoting healthy life style by producing, conserving and consuming good food.

Aashakiranam Cancer care campaign is a comprehensive project for the prevention and care of cancer envisaged by Caritas India.

Ashakiranam Cancer Care Campaign is designated jointly by Caritas India, a non-governmental organization, Diocesan Social Service Societies, hospitals, colleges, schools, etc., working in Kerala. In the humanitarian concern towards supporting the cancer patients and promote preventive approaches to the health cluster by mobilizing resources from people. The main components of the project are local fund mobilization,



cancer awareness and financial aid to deserving cancer patient. Aashakiranam program was launched by People's Service Society Palakkad in the year 2016 with the blessing of Emeritus Mar Jacob Manathodath, Bishop of Palghat. Caritas India is supporting the project.

Cancer being now a days becoming a manmade disaster (Life style), carried out across Kerala on 32 DSSS as cancer care campaign. In 2020, when Covid was in peak, nearly 57155 people were defected by cancer. In 2022, it jumped to 59143 in the state. In cancer related deaths, there were 32,271 in 2022. #### **CANCER AWARENESS SEMINAR**

In observance of November 7th as Cancer Awareness Day, the People's Service Society (PSSP), Palakkad, organized a cancer awareness seminar. The event highlighted the rapidly increasing prevalence of cancer in India, particularly among women, with cervical cancer being one of the most commonly diagnosed cancers after breast cancer.

The seminar discussed the unique nature of cervical cancer, which is caused by infections. It was shared that in India, vaccination programs have been implemented to prevent cervical cancer, targeting girls between the ages of 9 and 15. The seminar also addressed concerns about the potential link between the use of sanitary pads and an increased risk of cervical cancer. Studies have shown that certain sanitary products may contribute to the development of the disease.

In light of this, PSSP has started an initiative to promote women-friendly sanitary pads in the district, replacing the current ones in use. Additionally, the seminar featured the launch of a new sanitary pad with advanced technology for cervical protection, called Care and Safe, which was introduced as a healthier alternative to conventional products.

The seminar was attended by 250 women, and was chaired by Fr. Justin Kolamkanni, Executive Secretary of PSSP Palakkad. The keynote address was delivered by Fr. Saji Vattukalathil, Director of the Sain Organization. Shankar Iyer, CEO of A&B International, led the seminar.

## GREEN CAMPUS CAMPAIGN AND DEVELOPMENT OF MICROCLIMATE LOCATIONS IN THE DISTRICT OF PALAKKAD (GCDM)

The Green Campus Campaign and Development of Microclimate Locations (GCDM) project, spearheaded by the People's Service Society Palakkad (PSSP), is a visionary initiative aimed at addressing the critical environmental challenges posed by climate change, resource degradation and ecological imbalance in the Palakkad district of Kerala. Anchored in the principles of second encyclical of Pope Francis,' "Laudato Si', the project seeks to create tangible and replicable models of ecological restoration and sustainability at both institutional and community levels.





The project GCDM is built up on the foundations of seven goals of Laudato Si's concept of 'Integral ecology' as pronounced by Pope Francis.

- 1. Response to the cry of Earth
- 2. Response to the cry of the Poor
- 3. Ecological Economics
- 4. Adoption of Simple Life Styles
- 5. Ecological Education
- 6. Ecological Spirituality
- 7. Emphasis on Community Involvement and participatory Action

The GCDM project envisages to establish 150 micro climate units in 150 campuses of Institutions. This project is also in line with the 2030 Agenda for sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) adopted by all United Nations Member States.

#### Main Components of the Project:

**A. Promotion of Community Action Groups:** The Participatory Induction Workshop was the first step in initiating the Green Campus Development and Microclimate Locations (GCDM) project. The purpose of this workshop was to engage stakeholders and raise awareness about the project's objectives, strategies and environmental goals. The workshop involved representatives from 75 campuses across Palakkad, including institutions and local community members. It emphasized collaboration among stakeholders and introduced them to the project's participatory model.

#### Objective:

This activity aimed to introduce stakeholders, including parish representatives, institutional leaders and community members, to the objectives, vision and strategies of the GCDM project. It focused on building foundational knowledge about microclimate development and encouraging active participation.

#### Implementation:

A series of workshops were conducted across the project's 59 parishes and 16 institutions. These sessions emphasized the importance of ecological restoration and practical strategies to achieve it. Expert facilitators led discussions on microclimates, climate resilience and sustainable development practices. Participants were engaged through presentations, case studies and group exercises. Tools such as project outlines, visual aids and real-world examples from similar initiatives were used to make the sessions impactful.

- 75 Workshops: Each workshop tailored content to the specific needs and understanding of participants.
- Over 3000 Participants Trained: Participants included clergy, institutional staff, teachers and community leaders who could act as multipliers by disseminating the project's message.
- Formation of 320 Community Action Groups: These groups were established to implement activities at the grassroots level, ensuring continuous engagement and local leadership.

#### Outcomes:

- Enhanced Knowledge and Readiness: Participants developed a deeper understanding of ecological issues and became proactive in implementing solutions.
- Established Networks: The workshops created a collaborative platform for diverse stakeholders to exchange ideas and coordinate efforts effectively.

#### Impact:

- Strong Community Involvement: The workshops laid a foundation for the project's success by fostering a sense of ownership among participants.
- Increased Awareness on Climate Practices: A broad spectrum of stakeholders became equipped to address ecological challenges, extending the project's reach and influence.
- **B.** Development of Micro Climate Locations: A micro climate is the distinctive climate of a small geographical area such as campuses, homestead, garden, park, valley or part of a village or city. All the 150 project area beneficiary institutions have a well marked geographical area as campuses with proper ownership right. The GCDM project envisages to develop micro climate unit in all these campuses with the participation of the stakeholders like CAGs, management of the institutions, parent teachers association, parish administration and the local organizations. All the stakeholder and the beneficiary



population will understand the benefits of micro climate and its importance in Integral Ecology through awareness and capacity building activities.

#### C. Implementation / demonstration of water conservation methods

All the 150 selected Institutions have their own building structures with more than 2000 sq.ft. built area. Rain water harvesting through these roof and conserving the rain water in different methods will improve the sub surface water of the area. The project plans to develop water security campuses through various rain water harvesting and conservation methods. Each campus will harvest / capture the entire rain water and recharge it through appropriate recharge structures as noted below.

#### i. Rain Water Harvesting Tank with Well Recharging:

This activity aimed at installing rainwater harvesting systems across 75 campuses, helping to combat water scarcity and recharge the water table. Proven methods such as dug well recharging and borewell recharging were implemented. The rainwater collected from rooftops and other surfaces was directed into



these recharge structures, ensuring that each campus could capture significant amounts of water annually, supporting sustainability goals and community resilience.

#### Objective:

To promote water security by implementing innovative rainwater harvesting systems and techniques for groundwater recharge in project locations.

#### Implementation:

Rainwater harvesting systems were designed and installed across 75 locations, incorporating technologies such as rooftop catchments, open and borewell recharging. Training programs for community members and institutional staff ensured proper maintenance and usage. These systems were engineered to optimize rainwater capture, prevent runoff wastage and recharge aquifers.





#### **HARITHA SAMRUDHI PHASE 3 PROJECT**

The Haritha Samrudhi project is being implemented since 2019 in the Pudussery Gram Panchayat of Palakkad District, one of the largest Panchayats in Kerala,. This suburban Grama panchayath is located in the Palakkad gap and is rich in natural resources including forests, mountains, and rivulets and shares a border with Tamil Nadu, as well as the Gram Panchayats of Marutha road, Elapully, Vadakarapathi and Malampuzha. Pudussery Gram Panchayat comprises 23 wards. The total area of the Panchayat is approximately 7960 hectares, with 1404 hectares irrigated and 769.24 hectares unirrigated. The socio-economic conditions of Pudussery Gram Panchayat are influenced by factors such as population, infrastructure, education, employment opportunities, and agricultural activities.

#### **Project Components**

The main components of the Haritha Samrudhi Phase 3 project include:

- Implementation of Water Conservation Interventions
- Awareness generation on water conservation
- Revival of traditional rainwater harvesting systems
- Protection of water bodies
- Awareness generation on rainwater harvesting
- Nature conservation activities such as planting trees and saplings

The project aims to benefit the communities by improving the availability of water for domestic use, and irrigation. It is being implemented in a participatory manner, with the active involvement of the local community and Panchayat authorities.

#### Big Pond Deepening - Parappadikkal Pond, Pudussery West Village

The deepening of Parappadikkal Pond was a vital water conservation initiative aimed at increasing water storage capacity, enhancing groundwater recharge, and improving ecological balance. This project has brought long-term benefits to the local community by ensuring better water availability for both agricultural and domestic purposes.

#### The project, which commenced on January 17, 2025, has successfully achieved the following objectives:

- Expanded the pond's water retention capacity, mitigating water shortages.
- Enhanced groundwater recharge, ensuring a sustainable water supply.
- Prevented soil erosion and improved environmental health.
- Supported aquatic biodiversity by creating a stable water habitat.





#### The completed project has resulted in:

- Improved water availability for agricultural irrigation and livestock needs.
- Enhanced groundwater levels, reducing reliance on seasonal rainfall.
- Strengthened soil stability around the pond, preventing erosion and land degradation.
- Increased biodiversity through a sustainable aquatic ecosystem.

The deepening of Parappadikkal Pond marks a significant achievement in sustainable water management. The successful completion of this initiative has contributed to long-term environmental conservation and community well-being. Ongoing monitoring and maintenance will help preserve its benefits.

#### Big Pond Deepening- Kuppayyan Pond, Pudussery East Village

The project to deepen Kuppayyan Pond, initiated on February 14, 2025, and concluded in mid-March 2025, has successfully enhanced local water resources and environmental conditions. Its objective was to increase water storage, improve groundwater levels, and support ecological health.

Essential works completed include water removal, site clearance, excavation for increased depth, bund formation with geotextile reinforcement, installation of gabion erosion control fencing, placement of relevant signage, and tree planting.



#### The project's successful completion has led to measurable improvements:

- Expanded pond capacity, addressing water scarcity issues.
- Increased groundwater recharge for a more reliable water supply.
- Reduced soil erosion and improved environmental health through structural reinforcements.
- A more stable aquatic ecosystem supporting local biodiversity.
- Better water access for irrigation and livestock.



The Kuppayyan Pond deepening is a key achievement in water management, contributing positively to environmental conservation and community life. Sustaining these benefits will require regular monitoring and maintenance efforts.

#### Construction of Masonry Check Dam at Kannode, Big Pond Deepening- Kuppayyan Pond, Pudussery East Village

The construction of a masonry check dam at Kannode commenced on February 22, 2025. This vital infrastructure project was designed to enhance water management, support agriculture, and mitigate soil erosion by regulating water flow in the region.



#### Before construction began, essential preparatory tasks were successfully executed:


- Water Removal: Water was diverted to ensure a dry and safe construction site.
- Jungle Clearance: Dense vegetation and obstructions were removed to provide adequate space for construction.


Following the preparatory work, the dam's main structure was built with precision, ensuring durability and functionality. Key activities included:

- Laying the foundation.
- Constructing the masonry structure, adhering to safety protocols and construction standards.

The check dam was successfully completed in the third week of March 2025. Thorough inspections and quality checks were conducted to ensure compliance with all necessary standards.

The check dam is now fully operational, significantly improving water conservation efforts, benefiting the local community, and supporting agricultural lands. The project team remains committed to ongoing monitoring and maintenance for long-term sustainability.







#### Formal Handover of Haritha Samruddhi Phase 3 to Pudussery Gram Panchayat

The third phase of the 'Haritha Samruddhi' project, implemented by the People's Service Society Palakkad (PSSP) under United Breweries Limited's CSR initiative, was formally handed over to the Pudussery Grama Panchayat on March 28, 2025. The ceremony was held at the Community Hall in Pudussery and was inaugurated by Malampuzha Block Panchayat President V. Bijoy. Puthussery Panchayat President N. Praseetha presided over the function, while UBL Brewery Head Suresh Subramanian officially transferred the project to the Panchayat. Executive Secretary Fr. Ceejo Karikkattil delivered the welcome address. The event was attended by around 100 villagers, showcasing strong community involvement and support.





#### **RAIN WATER HARVESTING TANKS**

Rainwater harvesting tanks are specialized containers designed to collect and store rainwater runoff from roof tops, catchment areas and other surface for later use. The tanks play a crucial role in sustainable water management by reducing the demand on traditional water and helping to mitigate the impact of water scarcity and storm water runoff.

A typical rainwater harvesting tank with a capacity of 10,000 litres is a sustainable sized container suitable for residential and 50,000 litres for commercial or agricultural use. Here's a description of it's main features and components.



- **1. Capacity:** The tank has providing ample storage for harvested rainwater. The capacity can vary from 10K litres to 250K litres on harvesting areas.
- 2. Material: Rainwater harvesting tanks are commonly made of ferrocement technology.
- **3. Design:** The tanks typically have a cylindrical/rectangular shape with a flat base for stability. The design may also include a reinforced structure to withstand external pressure and environmental conditions
- **4. Inlet and outlet:** The tank has equipped with an inlet through which rainwater from the catchment area is collected and channeled in to the tank. An outlet is also provided to allow easy access to the stored water when needed
- **5. Filtration system:** A rainwater harvesting tank includes a filtration system to remove debris, leaves, and other impurities from the collected rainwater before it enters the storage compartment. This ensures the stored water remains clean and suitable for various purposes.
- **6. Overflow system:** To prevent the tank from overflowing during heavy rain fall an overflow system is integrated. Excess water is directed away from the tank and may be directed to additional rainwater structures or recharging to nearest open well or bore well or storm water.
- **7. Ventilation:** Adequate ventilation is essential to prevent the growth of algae and maintain the water quality inside the tank.
- **8. Water level indicator:** Rainwater harvesting tanks have a water level indicator that allows user to monitor the water level inside the tank easily. It helps in efficient water management and ensure the tank doesn't turn dry unexpectedly.
- **9. Pumps and distribution system (optional):** For application requiring pressurized water supply, rainwater harvesting structures may include pump and distribution system to supply water to different parts of building or property


